Minutes of the hearing held before the National Commission for Scheduled Castes, New Delhi

The hearing of the case of Shri Kishore Singh, R/o-Sohana, Gurugram, Haryana regarding compassionate grounds appointment in CPWD was held on 19.06.2024 before the National Commission for Scheduled Castes, New Delhi.

Shri Umesh Bansal, Chief Engineer, CPWD, Shri Rattan Gaur, AAO and other officers of CPWD were present. The petitioner, Shri Kishore was also present.

The case was discussed in details. The petitioner has stated that his wife was working in CPWD as a Safai karamchari and she died during her service. On her behalf, her elder son Shri Dheeraj Kumar should be given an appointment on the compassionate grounds. The Chief Engineer stated that the appointment of Shri Dheeraj Kumar S/o- Late Smt. Vidya Devi on compassionate grounds was considered by the Compassionate Appointments Board on the application received under the information issued in the year 2017. But Mr. Dheeraj Kumar could not be selected due to less weightage points i.e. 60 marks. The matter was reconsidered in the light of the re-issued notification the following year. The educational qualification required for MTS post is 10th pass, while Dheeraj Kumar is only 8th pass. In this connection, it is also informed that whenever any notification is issued in future, the matter regarding appointment on compassionate ground will be reconsidered on the application submitted by Mr. Dheeraj Kumar.

After hearing the case, it is observed that hearing of this case was held on 03.10.2023 in the Commission and Commission recommended the candidature may be considered in the post of MTS and till he possess the 10th pass, he may be allowed to continue to work as regular employee as trainee on compassionate ground. Shri Dheeraj Kumar received 60 marks whereas another SC received 68 marks as per parameters, therefore he was not selected. Since the Department agreed to consider petitioner's candidature for the Compassionate appointment, therefore Commission again reiterate its earlier recommendation as per rules. With these recommendations the case is disposed of in the Commission.
